

National Cemetery Pre-Need Eligibility

NATIONAL CEMETERY ADMINISTRATION, DC

On September 1, 1973, VA became the steward of the 112-year-old National Cemetery System, the forerunner of the National Cemetery Administration (NCA).

Today, NCA (<u>National Cemetery Administration</u>) manages 155 national cemeteries in the United States and provides grant-funding to 122 state, territory, and tribal veterans cemeteries. Over 4.1 million veterans of every conflict—from the Revolutionary War to the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan—are honored by burial in these cemeteries. NCA has assisted millions of veterans and their families in scheduling and arranging for burial at national cemeteries for themselves and their spouses.

In 2016, NCA developed a Pre-Need Eligibility application to assist families with burial planning. No longer do veterans or spouses need to wait until the time of death to find out if they are eligible for burial in a national cemetery or for memorial benefits such as a headstone, flat marker, or bronze medallion for use in private cemeteries.

In FY 2023, 55,374 Pre-Need applications were approved. There were 139,360 internments in national cemeteries and 33,566 national cemeteries and 33,566 headstones and markers provided for burial in private cemeteries. Pre-Need applications require the veteran's social security number, date/place of birth, military status and service history such as service dates, discharge character, and rank - information commonly found on the DD214 or other separation documents. If you do not have discharge documents, NCA staff will help obtain the information needed to determine eligibility or via mail or fax using this form www.va.gov/find-forms/about-form-40-10007/, or simply search for "NCA Pre-Need" on the internet.

If you have questions about future burial needs for yourself or a living dependent of a veteran, or you need assistance with submitting an application please call (800) 535-1117 and press 4. NCA's Scheduling Office is open Monday through Friday 8:00am to 7:30pm EST and Saturday 9:00am to 5:30pm EST except Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day. Do You Have a DS Logon?

MYAIRFORCEBENEFITS - A Department of Defense (DoD) Self-Service Logon, or DS Logon, offers secure, self-service access for Airmen, Guardians, retirees, surviving spouses, and families to informative government partner websites. The free DS Logon ID account allows its members access to their personal information on DoD and Veterans Affairs (VA) partner sites using a single username and password. It can be used for viewing personal profiles, health information, pending applications, open claims, and more.

The DS Logon can be used 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. New user accounts are verified through the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). Therefore, to obtain a DS Logon, all applicants must be affiliated with the DoD or VA and have a listing in DEERS under one of the following categories: active duty, Reserve Component, retiree, or veteran; eligible family members (over 18 years of age); DoD civilians and contractors.

MyAirForceBenefits encourages the use of a DS Logon for all Retirees and their eligible family members, Reserve Component gray area Retirees, and eligible surviving family members (those whose service member died while on active duty on or after September 11, 2001) who do not have a common access card (CAC).

A DS Logon allows access to the planning calculator tools for retirement, survivor benefits and SBP (Survivor Benefit Plan) premiums on MyAirForceBenefits. These tools can be used to assist with financial planning for retirement. A DS Logon is also essential for eligible surviving family members to access their Interactive Online Survivor Benefits Reports through the Casualty and Survivor Assistance tool on MyAirForceBenefits.

In preparation for retirement before you surrender your CAC, go online and apply for a DS Logon. A link to the DS Logon Registration page can be found on the MyAirForceBenefits homepage. Be sure to read the "DS Logon Support Documentation," found at the top of the registration page. This document is updated regularly with all relevant information concerning DS Logon. The registration page presents three ways to apply for an account. If you currently have a CAC, you can choose the "CAC option." Retirees, military spouses, and eligible family members that do not have a CAC but do have a valid DoD ID card can choose "Email Registration."

Those who do not have a CAC and do not have a valid DoD ID card, must choose "Remote Identity Proofing." However, another option is available to those who need to obtain a new DoD ID card. While at your RAPIDS ID appointment to receive a new DoD ID card, notify the Verifying Official that a DS Logon is desired. You will

provide your email address and follow the instructions given by the RAPIDS Operator. You will receive an email with the activation steps in 24 hours. The email is only good for 7 days and this process can only be done in coordination with receiving a new DoD ID card. "Remote Proofing" is offered as the last resort for obtaining a DS Logon. If this is the only option available to you, be sure to thoroughly read the "DS Logon Support Documentation" for the requirements prior to starting the process.


REAL ID and NextGen ID Card

Passed by Congress in 2005, the REAL ID Act was enacted in response to the recommendations of the 9/11 Commission to improve national security. The goal of the REAL ID Act is to prevent identity fraud by establishing minimum security standards for state-issued driver's licenses and identification cards. The Department of Homeland Security started Real ID Act enforcement on 7 May 2025. This affects what forms of documentation can be used to access certain federal facilities, military installations, and to board domestic commercial flights. You can check your state's compliance on the Department of Homeland Security website REAL ID | Homeland Security

Eventually, you will need to have the NextGen ID card because the old forms of ID will not be valid to access military installations; this will be true even if your old ID card has an INDEF expiration date on it.

Military retirees, dependents, and surviving spouses who already possess military, or DoD issued credentials, will still be granted installation access for the foreseeable future even if you have an "old style" ID card (DD Form 2, DD Form 1173, DD Form 1173-1 or DD Form 2765 (blue, pink or tan ID)). DoD will formally announce when a date has been set.



There are several ways to make an appointment to get a new ID card. You can visit the RAPIDS ID Card Office Locator website to find the closest office and either call them to make an appointment or schedule your own appointment using the website https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/ (will transition to myAuth as of 20 May 2025). To make an appointment using this site select the "ID Card Office Locator & Appointments" block. You may also be able to renew your ID card online and have it mailed to you. Select the "Family ID Cards" block on the website at the link above. Below are the requirements to renew a card online:

- Sponsor must be a CAC holder or have a DoD Self-Service Logon username/password
- Must be requesting a renewal of an active USID card
- Sponsor and cardholder must have email addresses listed in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) that they have authorized DoD to use for contacting them
- Sponsor's personnel status must extend at least 30 days into the future
- Cardholder has a photo saved in DEERS taken in the last 12 years
- Cardholder's mailing address is present in DEERS and is in United States or Overseas.
- USID cards cannot be shipped to PO Boxes

All old-style ID card holders are encouraged to get a NextGen ID card soon!

Changes to SBP/RCSBP Monthly Premiums

DFAS, CLEVELAND - Some retirees need to pay monthly Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) or Reserve Component Survivor Benefit Plan (RCSBP) premiums directly instead of having them deducted from pay because their VA disability compensation pay offsets their retired pay. We call that direct remittance.

Most of these payments are handled by the U.S. Department of Treasury Centralized Receivables Service (CRS), where retirees can make their payments online, use their bank's bill payment service, or pay through the mail.

In mid-2025, DFAS will change the payment process for retirees who pay their SBP or RCSBP premiums directly through Treasury CRS.

In the coming months, please watch for communications that will provide details and information about the mid-2025 changes and the actions you will need to take. There is no action you need to take right now, other than to make sure your mailing address is up to date so you can receive important communications.

Update Your Mailing Address

The quickest and easiest way to update your mailing address is to use myPay: https://mypay.dfas.mil. If you have trouble logging in to myPay, check the troubleshooting instructions on the Using myPay webpage or call 888-332-7411.

You can also use our convenient askDFAS online form to update your mailing address. You must answer the identity security questions correctly to have your request processed. See our handy askDFAS explainer page for details: https://www.dfas.mil/retonlinetools.

Additionally, you can complete a Retiree Change of Address/State Tax Withholding Request using the DD Form 2866.

INTERESTED IN WORKING ABROAD?

Ready to pursue a career beyond our nation's borders? Already received or been offered a job from a foreign based company?

Foreign Government Employment (FGE) is defined as any civil employment with a foreign government, regardless of whether or not payment of wages is received.



FOREIGN GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR FGE?

Any retired member of the armed forces seeking any civil employment with a foreign government or entity – or any instrumentality of a foreign government – must apply for permission ahead of time or risk losing DoD benefits. Separated members of the armed forces may be prohibited from working for certain foreign governments without prior approval, and doing so would risk loss of DoD benefits and/or security clearance.

CAN I START WORKING BEFORE MY FGE APPROVAL?

No. Retirees and certain separated armed forces members that fail to comply may have pay, allowances, or benefits provided by DoD withheld. In addition to losing benefits, security clearances may be revoked.

READY TO APPLY FOR FOREIGN GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT?

Frequently Asked Questions



Q: How do I change my mailing or email address to ensure receipt of DFAS correspondence?

A: Air & Space Force retired members and Survivor Benefit Plan annuitants should call the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) at 800-321-1080 to change their correspondence address or email or online at https://www.dfas.mil Members with a myPay account can make the change online at https://mypay.dfas.mil

Q: How do I request my military personnel records?

A: Airmen retired before Oct. 1, 2004, should contact the National Personnel Records Center website at https://www.archives.gov/personnel-records-center or call 314-801-0800. Submit a Standard Form 180 or letter of request to National Archives at St. Louis, National Personnel Records Center (Military), 1 Archives Drive, St. Louis, MO 63138. Request letters must include the Airman's name, Social Security number, contact information and specific record requested. Those requesting a relative's record also need to provide their relationship to the former Airman. Airmen and Guardians who retired on or after Oct 1, 2004, can request copies of records by submitting a Standard Form 180 or letter of request to:

Foreign Government Employment (FGE)

Q: I am employed by a U.S. company as an advisor. The company receives funds from a foreign entity for services, but I am paid by the U.S. company. Am I exempt from obtaining approval under the umbrella of the company?

A: No. All prior armed services members must obtain individual approval. Former service, rank, or duty position may impact individual eligibility for certain foreign government employment.

Q: I plan on working as an instructor pilot for a U.S. company providing training services to the government of Qatar. While I have a DD 214, I do *not* receive any retirement benefits from my time in the Service. Do I need to apply for approval to accept this position?

A: Yes. According to the National Defense Authorization Act of FY2024, FGE requirements are applicable to all prior members regardless of rank or type of discharge (retirement or separation). Before executing any FGE, prior members must obtain approval.

Department of the Air Force Retiree Activities Offices

Department of the Air Force Retiree Activities Offices (DAF RAO) are made up of retired volunteers from all services, including surviving spouses. Their charter is to coordinate, establish and staff an office on an active-duty, Reserve or Guard base through command channels that help retirees and surviving spouses with a myriad of
