Managing Your DFAS Pay Account Just Got Easier

DFAS, CLEVELAND — We continue to look for ways to make the important work of managing pay easier for military retirees, Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) annuitants, and survivors.

Using your feedback, along with ideas from our pay partners, we recently set out on a mission to make our askDFAS online tools experience more intuitive and helpful.

One comment we heard from retirees and SBP annuitants was: finding the way to an online upload tool or online form on askDFAS could be challenging.

So, this year, we undertook a major project to change that.

We refreshed the “Ask Retired Pay” module of askDFAS to make it easier to navigate. The changes combine the familiar functionality you’ve come to enjoy, while also expanding your options and reorganizing tools in a thoughtful way so you can easily find the correct tool for your request.

As you survey the new options on the “Ask Retired Pay” module of askDFAS, you’ll see reorganized and expanded online form upload tools, new self-service tools, and the opportunity to send account questions to the DFAS Cleveland Customer Care Center via an askDFAS ticket.

New Online Upload Tools

For both retirees and SBP annuitants, there are many new online upload tools. This means now you can submit any form or document you need to send us online as a PDF via these tools.

New Options for Retirees and SBP Annuitants to Ask Account Questions via askDFAS

Even more exciting, there are now new options for retirees and SBP annuitants to ask account questions online via askDFAS! Now you won’t have to always make a phone call to get the answer to a question!

New for SBP Annuitants: Update Your Mailing Address Online on askDFAS

For SBP annuitants, there is now an option to request the mailing address on file to be updated online via askDFAS. This request requires correct answers to the validation questions presented on the ticket.

2024 Department of the Air Force Retiree Council Meeting

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH AFB, TX— The Department of the Air Force Retiree Council convened June 11-13, 2024, for the 47th Department of the Air Force Retiree Council Meeting. The annual meeting was held at the Air Force Personnel Center, JBSA-Randolph Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas.

Major General Jefferson O'Donnell, Air Force Personnel Center commander, provided opening remarks to welcome the council members. O'Donnell charged the retiree communities to come up with ideas for assisting with retention and stressed the importance of benefits knowledge prior to retirement.

Over the course of the meeting, the group received

briefings from agencies including the Reporting System, Army & Air Force Exchange Service, Veterans Benefits Administration, My AirForce Benefits, Defense Health Agency, and others. These agencies shared information about updates and new initiatives to their programs that affect retiree communities worldwide.

The co-chair and council members compile the most important issues from Air and Space Force for review by General David Allvin, Chief of Staff of the Air Force.

In addition, the council members traveled to the Center for the Intrepid at Brooks Army Medical Center for a tour of the state-of-the-art facility.

Lieutenant General (Ret.) Darryl Roberson joined the council this year as co-chair, while a farewell was given to Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force #17 (Ret.) James Cody, who served for seven years as a council co-chair.

The council welcomed aboard three new area representatives, Master Sgt (Ret.) Eduardo Ramirez, Lt. Col. (Ret.) Barbara Hunter, and Master Sgt (Ret.) Richard Chavez. The council also welcomed one new Member-at-Large, Technical Sgt (Ret.) Christopher Ferrell.

Are You Missing Out On State Benefits?

MY AIR FORCE BENEFITS—

Did you know that you could be missing out on some great benefits? Whether you just joined the retired ranks or are a long-standing member of those still serving, states and territories offer a variety of benefits to you and your family. Benefits like property tax exemptions, employment preference and recreational discounts are offered not only to active-duty military but also to retired military, veterans, disabled veterans and family members.

You can find this benefit information all in one place on the MyAFB website. The State/Territory Fact Sheets have information on state income and property taxes, education and employment benefits, parks and recreation, Veterans Affairs (VA) facilities in the state, and more. This detailed information will help you find benefits in the state or territory where you live and the states and territories where you travel.

Maybe you are contemplating a move to a state that does not tax your retired pay. Each state fact sheet has up-to-date information on whether military retired pay is taxed and the availability of property tax exemptions for veterans. Several states have passed legislation in the past several

years to end or reduce state taxes on military pensions (most recently Montana and Virginia changed or began partial reductions) and others are actively considering similar changes. Check back often as state tax laws often change. The State/Territory Fact Sheets are kept up to date with the most recent information and provide links to the benefit details.

If you or your family members want to pursue higher education, check out the education benefits section for your state of residency. Many states offer scholarship programs for veterans, as well as spouses and children of veterans. For example, the Alabama G.I. Dependent Scholarship Program offers qualified spouses and children of eligible veterans up to 10 semesters of undergraduate education at a state-supported institution of higher learning plus \$1,000 per semester for textbooks and applicable fees.

The employment benefits section of each state fact sheet is a good place to look for state hiring preference information for veterans and special programs like New Mexico's Operation Sound Stage—a program designed to put military veterans to work on movie and TV productions in New Mexico. Many states have unique programs specific to their state so be sure to

also view the miscellaneous benefits section. You can find initiatives such as the Texas Veterans Land Board Loan Programs and the Service Dog Grant for North Dakota Veterans with PTSD.

Most states also offer discounts to retired airmen and guardians and veterans on state park admission and recreational activities such as camping, hunting, and fishing. For example, Colorado offers free admission to Colorado State Parks each August for veterans and service members. Florida offers a Military Gold Sportsman's License at a reduced fee of \$20 to all retired service members (regular price, \$100) that includes hunting, saltwater and freshwater fishing licenses, and other special permits. If you need to find a military installation or VA facility in your state or a state you are traveling to, look for the list of these facilities near the bottom of every state and territory fact sheet.

USAF Warrant Officer Training School Opens Doors at Maxwell AFB

MAXWELL AIR FORCE BASE, AL— Nine months after the U.S. Air Force announced the decision to reintegrate warrant officers into the force, the Warrant Officer Training School (WOTS) officially opened its doors with a ribbon cutting ceremony Sept. 25 at Maxwell Air Force Base.

WOTS welcomed the Air Force's first cohort of 30 warrant officer candidates to its facility. The inaugural class began Oct. 8.

"When the U.S. Air Force Chief of Staff directed us to bring back warrant officers two-hundred and twenty-six plus days ago... It was going to be here at Air University at Maxwell AFB," said Lt. Gen. Andrea D. Tullos, commander and president of Air University. "The warrant officers we develop here will step right in and join their joint partners on combatant commander's teams and give us the tactical, operational and strategic advantages that our force needs, anytime and anywhere."

WOTS is a 40-day training program, in-residence accessions program designed to educate and train candidates with specialized knowledge and technical skills on how to serve as technical advisors to command leadership in their future roles as warrant officers.

"The Warrant Officer Training School is a training program designed to develop professional warrant officers who can advise and integrate at various organizational levels," said Maj. Nathaniel Roesler, WOTS commandant.

"The program is a challenging, fast-paced, and highly structured educational program that integrates classroom lecture, guided discussion and experiential learning opportunities to reinforce educational understanding."

The Air Force dissolved its Warrant Officer Corps in 1958 following the creation of the Senior Master Sgt. and Chief Master Sgt. ranks, who took on warrant officer responsibilities. These senior non-commissioned officers took on specific technical duties but were never relieved of their Institutional requirements as part of the enlisted structure.

The reintroduction of the Warrant Officer Corps career path in the United States Air Force aims to address critical operational needs, while maintaining highly perishable skills, and simultaneously leveraging the unique expertise and capabilities of warrant officers.

"It took a shared vision and effort from Headquarters Air Force down through AETC, AU, the Holm Center and the 42nd Air Base Wing to bring this concept to fruition," Roesler said. "We had a long way to go and a short time to get there, but with the efforts of many of you sitting here and others within your organization we're ready to produce warrant officers for the Air Force... and this building is the physical evidence that this was not a paper drill."

Upon graduation from WOTS, the newly minted warrant officers will be assigned to a range of Air Force units as technical experts in cyber and information technology supporting both Air Force and joint force operational requirements.

The second WOTS class, also comprised of approximately 30 candidates, is scheduled to start Jan. 2025.

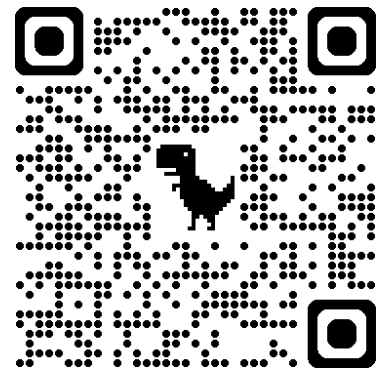
Retiree and Annuitant Pay Dates-2025 Pay Schedule

To help you plan for 2025, below is a list of the days you should expect to receive your pay. Retired and annuitant pay is due on the first of the month. However, if the first falls on a weekend or holiday, retirees are paid on the last business day of the month and annuitants are paid on the first business day of month.

Frequently Asked Questions



Q: How do I change my mailing or email address to ensure receipt of DFAS correspondence?

A: Air & Space Force retired members and Survivor Benefit Plan annuitants should call the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) at 800-321-1080 to change their correspondence address or email. Members with a myPay account can make the change online. The fax number is 800-469-6559 for retirees and 800-982-8459 for annuitants. The address is DFAS, US Military Retirement Pay, 8899 E 56th Street, Indianapolis IN, 46249, for retired members; and DFAS, US Military Annuitant Pay, 8899 E 56th Street, Indianapolis IN, 46249, for annuitants. See the Contacts & Resources page (8) for contact information on notifying DEERS, Medicare, TRICARE, the Social Security Administration, and other agencies as appropriate.

Q: How do I request my military personnel records?

A: Airmen retired before Oct. 1, 2004, should contact the National Personnel Records Center website at <https://www.archives.gov/personnel-records-center> or call 314-801-0800. Submit a Standard Form 180 or letter of request to National Archives at St. Louis, National Personnel Records Center (Military), 1 Archives Drive, St. Louis, MO 63138. Request letters must include the Airman's name, Social Security number, contact information and specific record requested. Those requesting a relative's record also need to provide their relationship to the former Airman. Airmen who retired on or after Oct 1, 2004, can request copies of records by submitting a Standard Form 180 or letter of request to AFPC, 550 C ST. W, JBSA-Randolph AFB TX 78150; fax 210-565-4021, or DSN 665-4021. Request letters must include the Airman's name, Social Security number, contact information and specific record requested. Those requesting a relative's record also need to provide their relationship to the former Airman.

Q: Can the AF Retiree Services office assist me with correcting personnel records?

A: The Retiree Services office **does NOT have access to personnel records and cannot make changes** to a member's record. To request a correction to your records, please either call the AFPC Total Force Service Center at 800-525-0102 or visit the AFPC website at <https://www.afpc.af.mil/Career-Management/Military-Personnel-Records/>

Q: How can I request a replacement Air Force award or decoration?

Department of the Air Force Retiree Activities Offices

Department of the Air Force Retiree Activities Offices (DAF RAO) are made up of retired volunteers from all services, including surviving spouses. Their charter is to coordinate, establish and staff an office on an active-duty, Reserve or Guard base through command channels that help retirees and surviving spouses with a myriad of actions.

These actions include: serving as an information center for TRICARE, base services, etc.; offering referrals for financial assistance and pay matters; counseling active-duty Airmen/Guardians nearing retirement; and

providing guidance on retirement issues.

Another major activity involves working with base agencies to set up Retiree Appreciation Day events, offering briefings by different agencies on respective services, tax preparation and advice (at selected locations); staff judge advocate assistance, base tours, and more.
